- Do not edit our pieces other than making minor changes to adhere to your publication's preferred style guide. It's OK to add serial commas if that's what your newsrooms uses, for example. Ask for permission to make major changes, including translations into other languages. - Do not make changes to headlines without asking for permission.
- Note that you're not required to include the text of the sub-head that appears below the headlines of our pieces. (But you're welcome to include it if you wish).
